
Overview of District

SAT DATA 2011-2012 / 2013-2014

The SAT is a globally recognized college entrance exam administered by the College Board. It contains 3 sections – math, reading, and writing – and is generally taken by students in their junior or senior year of high school. The Idaho Department of Education provides the test, free of charge, to all students in their junior year as a means of encouraging college-going rates and facilitating the application process.

• The average scores for Idaho high school juniors remained similar year over year: 446 in writing (447 in 2012), 452 in critical reading (448 in 2012), and 452 in mathematics (454 in 2012). A score of 500 in each subject area has shown a student will be successful in postsecondary education after high school. IRI DATA

The Idaho Reading Initiative, enacted by the Idaho Legislature, was designed to ensure that all children in the State of Idaho will master the skills they need to become successful readers. The purpose of the assessment, the Idaho Reading Indicator (IRI), is to indicate which children are most likely going to be at-risk of failure with skills that are prerequisite for being successful readers throughout life. As is written in the statute, the state K-3 assessment test results shall be reviewed by school personnel for the purpose of providing necessary interventions to sustain or improve the students' reading skills.

ISAT DATA

The (Idaho Standards Achievement Test) ISAT is administered to students in grades 3-10 to provide ongoing monitoring of individual, school, district, and state progress. Academic proficiency is more than test scores. Competency in reading, language usage, mathematics, and science is the goal for every child. In accordance with No Child Left Behind, the ISAT measures proficiency in four key areas: reading, language usage, mathematics, and science. School year 2012-2013 is the last year ISAT testing is being done. The ISAT test is being replaced with the (Standards Based Assessment) SBAC test with scores to be recorded school year 2014-2015.

Implement comprehensive improvement plans for elementary and jr/sr high schools through staff and student input and present to school board at September meeting.
