Community and Adult Education

The District makes its resources available to adults and other nonstudents within the limits of budget, staff, and facilities, provided there is no interference with or impairment of the regular school program. Community school, adult education, and other offerings may be developed in cooperation with community representatives, subject to approval and authorization by the Board.

The District may offer remedial classes during the summer months if and when the need arises, providing funding is available. The administration may assess the need for such instruction, attempt to find faculty members interested in summer teaching, and determine financial resources available to fund instructional programs.

Adult classes will normally be pursued through the professional technical education programs or in conjunction with the University of Idaho or Lewis Clark State College. A community survey may be used to determine the need for adult programs. Adult courses may be funded jointly by the District, a sponsoring institution, and a tuition charge to program enrollees. District faculty members will be used whenever possible to teach adult classes offered within the District or which use District facilities.
